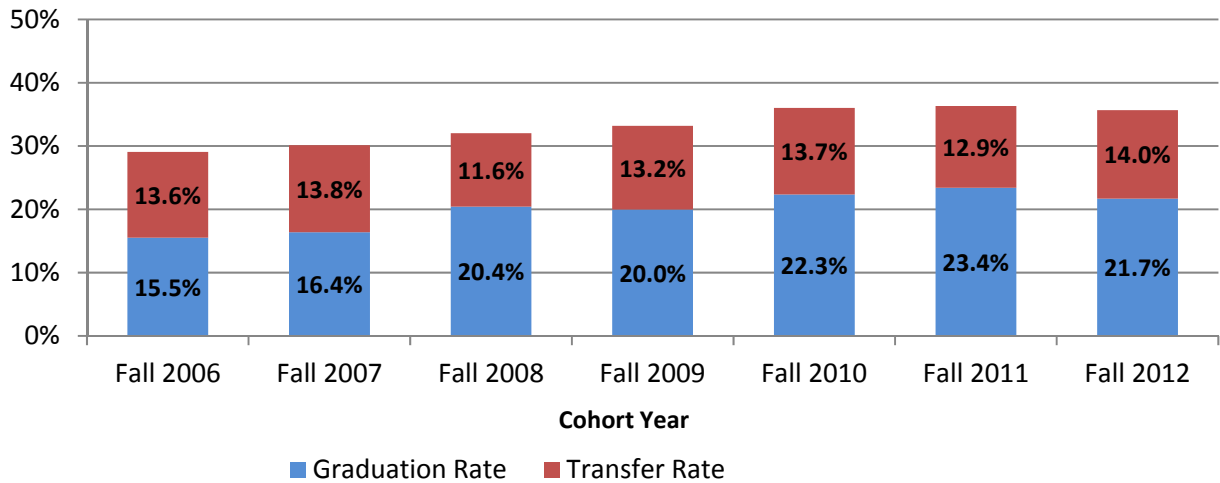


## Cohort Graduation and Transfer Rates



### Cohort Graduation and Transfer Rates after Three Years

*This table provides information in accordance with certain provisions of HEA 668.45 (a)(5). This federal mandate was designed to provide public access to comparable information from different colleges.*

**"Cohort" includes only first-time students entering during the fall term who are seeking an associate degree or certificate. It also includes first time prior summer students who returned in Fall, or those who have been dual enrolled in the previous 4 years, BUT not currently dual enrolled.**

**HEA 485(a)(7)(A) exempts two-year colleges from reporting requirements on some other breakdowns of graduation rates.**
