

LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES #4

JANUARY 11, 1967

The Local Advisory Board for The Community College at Roanoke was called to order at 8:00 P.M. on Wednesday, January 11, 1967, by Chairman W. S. Russell in the Board Room of The Shenandoah Life Insurance Company. Present were: Vice-Chairman Henry E. Thomas, Barton W. Morris, Jr., S. Colston Snead, W. Darnall Vinyard, Dr. Frank B. Wolfe, and Dr. Travis M. McKenzie.

Mr. Snead's motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was seconded and passed.

Mr. Russell indicated that the main purpose of the meeting was to select a name for the college.

Mr. Vinyard moved that the Board go into executive session. Dr. Wolfe seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

Mr. Morris moved that the Board recommend to the State Board for Community Colleges the name Virginia Western Community College as the official name for the college. The motion was seconded by Mr. Snead. It passed on a majority vote and the Board agreed to unanimously recommend this name to the State Board. Dr. McKenzie indicated that he would contact Dr. Hamal and inform him of the Board's recommendation.

Dr. McKenzie announced that the deadline of January 10 had been met for the Federal Grant. He indicated that a series of conferences with the architects and members of the faculty would begin the following Monday. He further indicated that he will make a 1968-70 capital outlay request of \$2.7 million to the Department of Community Colleges. The dental technology program at the community college will be one of three in the State of Virginia.

Mr. Morris suggested that the members of the Board invite members of the Virginia General Assembly who represent the areas served by the community college to a dinner meeting at the Shenandoah Club for the purpose of going over the proposed plans for the college. The group will assemble at the college at 4:30 P.M. on Wednesday, February 8, 1967, for a tour of the campus and will adjourn to the Shenandoah Club for dinner and a meeting with the architects. It was further suggested that Dr. Thomas V. Jenkins, newly-appointed Administrative Assistant to the President of the college, be invited to the dinner meeting also.

Dr. McKenzie announced that arrangements are underway to use five classrooms in the National Guard Armory next Fall Quarter.

It was decided that at a later date members of Roanoke City Council and the area Board of Supervisors will be invited to the college to tour the campus and view the plans for the college. The meeting may possibly be arranged during the break between the Winter and Spring Quarters.

Mr. Sneed moved that the meeting adjourn. Mr. Thomas seconded the motion, and the meeting adjourned at 9:13 P.M.
