Applicants being considered for the summer LPN to RN transition must be able to complete the <u>prerequisites</u> successfully ("C" or better) by the <u>end of the</u> Fall 2022 semester for consideration for summer 2023. They are:

Students who wish to apply for the transition should consider whether they currently meet the requirements as specified and/or able to complete any remaining coursework by the end of the <u>fall</u> semester (2022). Employment during the transition is strongly discouraged. Your time will be significantly impacted by the coursework, which will be a major commitment. Effective time management skills will be essential throughout the process.

A nursing skills entrance examination (KAPLAN) will be required in November/December for all applicants being **considered** for the transition program. Only applicants who are prepared and can meet the academic requirements established for the summer 2023 transition and <u>registered and attended the mandatory informational session</u>, during fall (September 1 to November 1, 2022), will be considered and notified about the administration of the test. Students will be selected based on the results of this exam and GPA's. The number of students participating in the summer transition will be <u>limited</u> to allow both faculty and students a learning environment to focus on the transition objectives during a fast-paced 10-week semester. Students **selected** to participate in the summer transition must be prepared for a rigorous **summer semester** with concentrated nursing studies to include the following courses:

NSG 115 (Healthcare Concepts for Transition – 5 credits)

NSG 200 (Health Promotion and Assessment – 3 credits)

Note: If you have not completed BIO 150 (Micro) prior to summer 2022, you must complete it with the 2 courses above.

<u>Notes:</u> Students may only attempt the transition track once. Credit or course substitution will not be awarded for the <u>First Level</u> Nursing courses <u>until</u> satisfactory completion of the Second Level nursing coursework (students must successfully complete all NSG coursework as outlined in the Nursing Student Handbook). The transition courses will include nursing lectures, nursing skills labs (NSL), simulation labs, and clinical experiences.

Applicants should be aware that there are additional general education requirements in the curriculum which must be completed. Includes BIO 150 (Introductory Microbiology), PHI 220 (Ethics), Elective (must be Soc200, Eng112, or Hlt230). These are not prerequisites, but applicants are encouraged to complete **prior to transition** when possible.
