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Notes:

- Students seeking this degree through the HB1184 pathway, must submit the *Dual Enrollment HB1184 Declaration of Intent* form and adhere to the academic calendar for graduation application and fees. Degree requirements are determined by the date of the receipt of the HB1184 form, the first-class enrollment date after acceptance into HB1184 and the VWCC catalog year requirements in effect at that time.
- At least 25% of course work for this degree must be completed through VWCC campus classes or dual enrollment course work at the high schools
- Students seeking to use AP, CLEP or IB exams to satisfy a requirement, should verify the exam, required score and VWCC corresponding course for compliance
- Course Substitution requests must be approved for the VWCC division dean.
